An Overview with the Board Investigator

Nearly five years ago I received a call from Christine Turk, the Executive Director of the Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors – I vow to not use the full title in the remainder of this article, but will refer to this group of fine people as the “Board”. The purpose of Christine’s call was to ask me to perform an “investigation”. She very patiently explained that a “complaint” had been filed with the Board – a complaint alleging a registrant had done something wrong. She further explained when a complaint is received the Board conducts an investigation and, based on the findings of the investigation, decides whether or not the complaint has merit and if disciplinary actions are required to be adjudicated upon the registrant.

That was a lot of information to process. Until I received that call I quite frankly knew very little about the law enforcement duties of the Board. Regarding the Board’s world, I was enjoying my life in a naive stupor wherein the Board’s responsibilities were limited to getting engineers and land surveyors licensed, and keeping these professionals licensed through the biennial communiqué requesting payment and a PDH report. Thoughts of complaints, investigations, and disciplinary actions never entered my mind.

Historically, as I later learned, complaints were investigated by a member of the Board who would then report back to the full Board. This practice could, at times, become burdensome on Board members and occasionally, albeit rarely, the Board would reach out and tap other registrants to assist in the investigative work.

After due consideration and internal deliberations I accepted the assignment, executed an Agreement with the Board, and began the investigation. In addition to learning how to spell “Complainant”, and learning which one of the parties is the “Respondent”, I became very familiar with the Wyoming Surveyors and Engineers Practice Act (Title 33, Chapter 29, Sections 33-29-114 through 33-29-139), the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Board, and the codes of ethics for engineers and land surveyors which are a significant and important part of the Rules and Regulations. I do recall reading these documents early in my engineering career, but it had been a long time and long since dismissed from a brain of limited storage capacity.

The first step in the investigation was to analyze the documents submitted with the complaint to determine the facts of the complaint, the wrongdoings the “Complainant” was alleging the “Respondent” had committed, and the specific provisions of the law that were being violated if the allegations were, in fact, true. This initial analysis resulted in more questions than answers, and these questions were duly recorded to be addressed in subsequent phases of the investigation.

After that hurdle had been cleared, and I thought I had everything properly aligned in my mind, I held my initial discussions with the Investigative Board Member (IBM). The IBM is selected by the Board President to work with the Investigator and bring the results of the investigation back to the Board with findings, conclusions, and recommended actions to be taken by the Board. The IBM is the only member of the Board allowed to become knowledgeable about the complaint – the remainder of the Board members are mandated to remain ignorant of the complaint in order to provide an impartial panel of judges should the complaint advance to the hearing phase.

The Board has a full arsenal of potential actions to deal with complaints – ranging from dismissing the complaint to revocation of Respondent’s license. Fortunately, the Practice Act graciously provides a number of options between these two extremes, i.e. probation, censure, fines, mandatory education, peer review, etc.

My initial discussions with the IBM established a strategy for the investigation. My clear mission for the investigation, per the Agreement executed with the Board, was to gather evidence to support or refute the complaint, and present these findings to the IBM to form conclusions and recommended Board action. Throughout this investigation, and every investigation completed subsequent to the maiden voyage, everyone I contacted was burdened with the standard speech defining and clarifying my role as the Investigator as a “fact finder”, as a “gatherer of data” – emphasizing that: 1) I am not a member of the Board; 2) I work for the Board; and, 3) the Board is solely responsible for any actions to be taken as a result of the complaint.

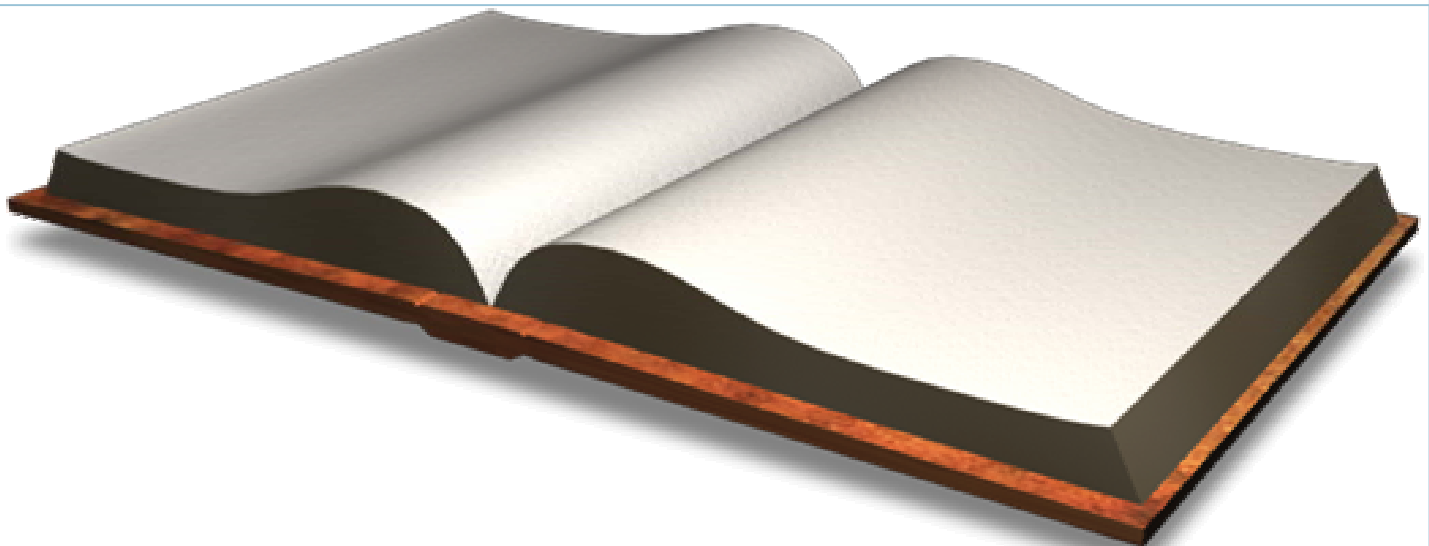
Over a period spanning approximately eight weeks a number of documents – including drawings, photographs, reports, certificates, etc. – were reviewed, a site reconnaissance was made, and seven individuals were interviewed. By design the first interview was with the Complainant to gain additional insight and to obtain answers to questions that resulted from the analysis of the submitted complaint documents. The analysis of documents and the interviews lead to the identification of additional documents and new witnesses to validate previously collected facts or answer questions arising during the investigation.

At the conclusion of the research and interviews the investigation and its findings were compiled into a report of investigation and submitted to the IBM. At that point my role (and career) as an Investigator was terminated with the understanding I could be called upon to clarify the content of the report or provide testimony should the matter advance to the hearing phase. I have to admit at the time the final report was delivered into the hands of the IBM that I found the entire experience to be educational, challenging, and rewarding.

Shortly after completing the investigation the Board began a formal proposal solicitation designed to contract with an individual to perform investigations for all complaints filed with the Board. Given my positive experience from my first (and only) investigation I responded to the solicitation and received a favorable judgment. Early in 2004 I entered into an Agreement with the Board to be their Investigator and am currently contracted to serve in that capacity through June 30, 2009.

Including the initial investigation in 2003, I have been involved in twenty-three complaints, twenty-two as the principal Investigator and one as a supplemental Investigator in a case that had been pending before the Board since 2003. Full investigations, which include extensive research, interviews, and preparation of a report of investigation, were completed for eighteen of the complaints and four of the complaints resulted in Board action after minimal analysis without extensive research, interviews, and preparation of a report. One of the complaints has just been received and no action has been taken.

Who filed the complaints?

Eight of the complaints were filed by property owners claiming they were injured as a result of the actions of the Respondent.

Five of the Complainants were clients of the respondent.

Three of the actions were initiated by members of the Board when they became aware of individuals completing boundary surveys without proper registration, stamping survey documents without adequate involvement, and offering engineering services without the benefit of registration.

Three of the complaints involved testimony before a public body where the Complainant was either on the opposite side of the Respondent, or a member of the hearing panel. In two of these complaints the Respondent provided expert engineering testimony without the benefit of Wyoming registration.

One of the complaints was filed by a contractor against the project engineer.

Two of the Complainants were competitors of the Respondents alleging they were injured as a result of actions by the Respondents.

One of the Complainants had an unknown status.

Who were the complaints filed against?

The Respondents in sixteen of the complaints were engineers, and seven of the complaints were against surveyors.

Two of the Respondents were in public service with the remainder in private practice.

Eighteen of the Respondents were Wyoming residents and the other five are required to pay the additional fee to fish our streams.

Please note the above statistics are not appropriate for use to draw conclusions relative to which professionals are the better practitioners – surveyors or engineers. The data is not complete. The Board recently contracted with a second Investigator to assist in the investigative workload, and the complaints reviewed by the second Investigator are not included in the above data.

I'll close by giving some brief remarks regarding my investigative experience. For the most part the investigations completed as the Board's contract Investigator have followed the procedures and protocols developed during the first investigation conducted in 2003. Some complaints, however, do require "tweaking" the process, but not significantly.

Instances of resistance and noncooperation have been extremely rare, and for this I am grateful. For the most part, individuals I came in contact with have been responsive and helpful. Complainants are seeking their "day in court" and the satisfaction their complaint received full consideration and deliberation. Respondents want to resolve the issues, pay their debt to society (if required), and move on with their business and their career.

Throughout the investigation process I found it critical, although not always easy, to keep from forming an opinion as to the veracity of the complaint allegations. Keeping an impartial perspective requires a focus on the mission of the Investigator which is to gather evidence, and leave the formulation of conclusions to those at a higher pay grade. After all, we can rest assured the Governor made the right choices when he filled the seats on the Board.
